### **Note From Our Executive Director**

We are humbled by your resilience. On behalf of the students and communities whose lives you touch more than you will ever know, thank you. Despite job losses, health complications and school closures, you were still there, supporting us every step of the way. Our team members continued to raise their hand, each dedicating 900+ hours of their time to ensure we did not let the students we sponsor down. During an unprecedented year, we didn't just achieve our goal, we exceeded it. We received Guidestar's Platinum Seal of Transparency and crossed the \$500K mark for the first time, putting us in the top 30% of charities in the US.

I want to live in a world where every child has access to educational institutions that shape their identities as much as mine did. I'm confident we've found those educational institutions in our partner schools. Despite a lack of technological resources and a reduction in staff, our partner schools redesigned the way they delivered education and provided for their students. ### The Education Crisis

60 million children today do not attend primary school, and vulnerable communities around the world are most impacted.

In these communities we serve, it costs an average of \$360 for a child to go to school for one year, though families often make less than that and can face significant additional obstacles. These include class and gender discrimination, abject poverty, illness, natural disaster, food and water shortages, domestic and community violence, and much more.

Children who don't receive an early education are 70% more likely to engage in violent crimes. They are significantly more likely to face exploitation. Not educating girls translates into a loss of \$15 to \$30 trillion in lost earnings and productivity for the world economy.

Education lifts children, their families, and communities out of generational poverty.





## Our Purpose



#### WHO WE ARE

At Brighter Children, we believe in a world where every child has access to quality early education. Our mission is to identify and support educational entrepreneurs who provide quality education to vulnerable children in some of the most impoverished communities in the world.



#### WHAT WE DO

We invest in education entrepreneurs who are reimagining a world we know is possible with access to quality early education. We then provide those children who are at-risk of dropping out of school with annual scholarships. On average, it costs \$360/year to sponsor the education of a child whose family often has less disposable income than that.



#### HOW WE WORK

We undergo a thorough diligence process to identify and screen entrepreneurs who are leading high-potential school systems and have years of experience delivering quality education with support from their local community. Our team works closely to ensure that every dollar is accounted for and then provides reports back to our donors. 100% of all public donations are used to sponsor the education of vulnerable children.



### **Our Value Proposition**

Our development model combines the principles of venture capital with charitable giving to drive holistic, sustainable and scalable impact. As a venture philanthropy firm, we use the charitable donations we receive to support education entrepreneurs who are helping us co-create a world our hearts know is possible.



#### VENTURE PHILANTHROPY

No single organization can solve complex social problems on its own. That's why we invest in a portfolio of diverse education entrepreneurs who are advancing on-the-ground results in their local communities. Instead of treating charities like charity cases, we think of them and invest in them as businesses - helping them scale, become more efficient, and deliver a better Return on Investment (ROI).



#### FOCUS ON ENTREPRENEURS

We identify education leaders with organizations creating scalable positive impact. We bet that these education entrepreneurs have charted a path to fundamentally transform the lives of out-of-school children in impoverished communities and choose to invest at their inflection point towards scale.



#### MULTI-YEAR SUPPORT

These organizations need to spend their time and resources growing, not fundraising. Ongoing support allows schools to deliver quality education, target 100% graduation rates, and provides short-term and long-term financial stability and flexibility.



#### DEEP ADVISORY SUPPORT

Our support is geared towards building the leadership capacity of education entrepreneurs and their ability to make strategic choices as they navigate change and growth.




#### STAGE




### Stories from the Field


## Impact by the Numbers

## COVID-19: Its Impact, Our Response

Shin Fujiyama has been working in the poorest regions of Honduras since founding **Students Helping Honduras (SHH)** in 2007. Since our initial investment in 2013, SHH has grown tremendously. According to Shin, "when we [SHH] started to partner with Brighter Children, everything changed. When we started the school, we had 48 students in just three grades. We now have over 270 students all the way from preschool to high school..."

Brighter Children was quick to see the pandemic was going to wreak havoc on our partner schools. SHH lost 90% of revenue sources due to Covid-19 as the majority of its funds comes from student sponsored trips and student-led campaigns. We are proud to say we were one of SHH's most stable sources of funding during this time.

Not only did we provide SHH with financial support, but we provided moral support as well. We initiated multiple check-in calls with Shin to reaffirm our support to him, his students and teachers. Unfortunately, our planned trip to Honduras in April 2020 had to be rescheduled. We look forward to the day we can play soccer with the students, enjoy meals with the teachers and latin dance with Shin!





## COVID-19: Learning Continues at Partner Schools

Our partner schools have been ensuring that the students continue to learn in a safe environment. Teachers are trying to deliver uninterrupted learning via WhatsApp and virtual centers. We commend our partner schools for supporting their teachers and communities during this difficult period.





From keeping in constant contact with vulnerable students, and ensuring they are well fed, to paying the teachers and staff, Village Project Africa (VPA) has been facing the challenging situation with determination.





Educate Girls (EG) in India is responding to the risks posed by the pandemic by reaching out to the volunteers and the communities they serve. As most girls and their families face dire economic and health conditions due to loss of income streams, EG has been focusing on advocacy and communication to ensure their well-being.





At Colombia Childcare (CCC) virtual classes are going well despite limited resources like the internet, laptops and cell phones. Students are bravely overcoming the social strife alongside their own problems owing to the pandemic.



Since 2013, Brighter Children has funded over 2.8 million hours of education for 2,000+ children.

You can directly invest in this fund to sponsor a child's education including tuition, school supplies, a daily meal and basic healthcare.


#### UNRESTRICTED FUND

You can directly invest in this fund to support our most pressing needs which can vary from operating costs to sending vulnerable children to school.






### **Sources of Funds**

Note: Cumulative aggregate growth rate is based on funds raised year-over-year. In 2019 and 2020, we set aside unrestricted funds from third-party donors to hire full-time staff and anticipate any additional support schools may require due to impact of COVID. We anticipate increasing the number of sponsored children in 2021. 2015-16 is an eighteen month period given we changed our year end from December to June.

We crossed the \$500K mark for the first time. For comparison, only 30% of U.S. nonprofits are larger than Brighter Children.






## **Financial Efficiency Score**

Charity Navigator only rates organizations which generate at least \$1M in revenue. Our calculations are based on guidance provided by Charity Navigator.
